Working at Heights Policy

Scope

Centurion is committed to minimising risks associated with employees and contractors working at heights. This policy will apply to all staff required to undertake any tasks above two meters from the ground.

Policy

It is the objective of this policy to minimise the risk of injury occurring while working at heights. All staff working at heights must wear the appropriate safety equipment. It is the responsibility of the supervisor or competent person to ensure that employees are issued with equipment and that the equipment is in good working order.

The supervisor must assess the risks associated with the work and ensure that employees are aware of hazards and that, as far as possible, risks are minimized. It is the responsibility of the supervisor or competent person to ensure that employees working at heights receive adequate training and supervision.

Employees must take all precautions when working at heights. Prior to working at height the employee must conduct a Take 5 to assess the risks associated with the intended tasks. If unsure of correct technique, employees must consult their supervisor before undertaking any tasks at height.

Working at Heights Guidelines

Working at two or more meters from the ground is classified as "Working at Heights", however a fall can occur at any height and Risk need to be assessed prior to start.

While working in a man cage a correctly fitted and attached fall restraint system must be used.

The deck of a trailer can be accessed if the risks are assessed (Take 5) and there are no trip hazards. Climbing over freight on a trailer is not permitted without fall restraint equipment or controls in place to reduce the risk of a fall. Do not jump off trailers at any times. Mezzanine decks are not to be accessed without fall restraint equipment.
